History

The Ruiru Rehabilitation Centre, located 22km outside Nairobi, Kenya, began as a community feeding programme in 1997 which sought to respond to a growing number of street children in Ruiru town who needed critical assistance. Local residents fed the children once or twice a week but soon realized that more organized support was needed.

In 1998, Mr. Kimani, a local business man, responded by offering part of his estate and existing facilities as temporary shelter. Soon, other generous donations ensued giving birth to the Ruiru Rehabilitation Centre.

In the years that followed, the centre grew as more people became interested and involved locally and internationally. From 2007 - 2011 the RRC was located in semi-permanent structures on the edge of Ruiru. By April 2011, friends and supporters of the centre eventually raised enough funds to hire full-time staff and buy a center with the infrastructure of a children's home already in place.

At this new property, we can now accommodate up to 60 children. The property also features a water borehole providing us with clean and safe water and caters for a gardening project, to provide the children with some vegetables.

The Center: a home for children

The Ruiru Rehabilitation Centre is a registered NGO home to children rescued from the streets, orphaned by HIV! AIDS, or who have been entrusted to the centre by family members unable to give them proper care. Our children, currently between the ages of 8 to 14, live at the centre, are provided basic necessities and receive formal education. We also support children at boarding school as well as higher learning institues

The centre is a safe haven that cultivates joy and laughter, a foster family with brothers and sisters that can relate, a place where our children can dream of a better future and where hurts from the past find healing in an environment of love, care and affection.



Centre's objectives



- Provide for the children's basic needs, including food, shelter, clothing, health care
- Assist children's healing process from hurt and trauma
- Provide formal education
- Teach practical skills and offer vocational training
- Promote community participation, ownership and responsibility
- Foster the reintegration of children into their extended family when feasible
- Empower the children and enhance their self confidence through artistic and cultural training and activities
- Expose children to other cultures to broaden their knowledge and world views
- Raise children's awareness of environmental sustainability and responsibility

Education & vocational training

The Ruiru Rehabilitation Centre ensures that every child receives formal education all the way to college.

The centre continues to support children who want to pursue college education by helping them find sponsors. The centre also helps those who choose vocational training and apprenticeship in hope of finding a job on the local market.

We closely monitor our children's progress. The objective is for them to acquire quality knowledge and skills that will help them find their place in society, join the workforce and become resourceful and self reliant

Staff members

Our local staff are in charge of the day-to-day management of the centre. They coordinate children's daily chores and activities, and oversee their overall wellbeing, health and safety. The staff also maintains contact with our children's known living extended family members, whenever possible, making regular home visits and keeping them updated on the progress of their children.
